

## Newton City/County Annual Report



In 2022 the Newton City/County Airport continued to rebound from the previous 2 years. We were able to complete our Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) project on taxiway E. The airport was also able to complete the office renovation of Hangar A, and begin the renovation of Hangar M. The airport created two new positions, another Airport Operations Specialist/Line Attendant, and a Building Maintenance Technician. We also replaced an employee this year as well.

**Total Expenditures for 2022: \$1,689,009.23**

Those expenditures included but were not limited to personnel expenses, aviation fuel, commodities, and contractual services. Approximately \$720,836 were spent on purchasing fuel for resale. Approximately \$32,964 on building maintenance. Airport personnel completed over 150 requests for building maintenance to our tenants this year.

**Total Revenue for 2022: \$1, 902,093.44**

Airport revenue is generated by but not limited to building leases, ground leases, fuel sales and aircraft storage. Newton City/County Airport sold 170,766 gallons of aviation fuel in 2022. This was slightly down from 2021 but up significantly from 2019 and 2020. Total revenue from fuel sales was approximately \$911,558. The airport also collected approximately \$636,887 on hangar and ground lease payments. Our hangars continue to be full, including our 85 T-hangars.

The airport staff continues to work hard on maintaining the 880 acres the airport sits on. They are also busy maintaining 5.47 miles of runway and taxiway. As well as working with City of Newton Street Maintenance crews, to maintain our six city streets. Newton City/County Airport saw approximately 68,000 aircraft operations in 2022.

The Newton City/County Airport will continue to be a place where the traveling public can visit and be assured that the airport staff is doing everything they can to ensure a safe and efficient experience. We will continue to be a place that the citizens of Newton can be proud of.
